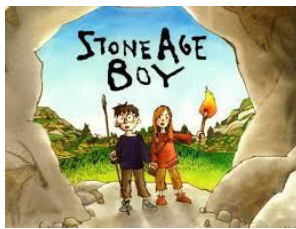

History

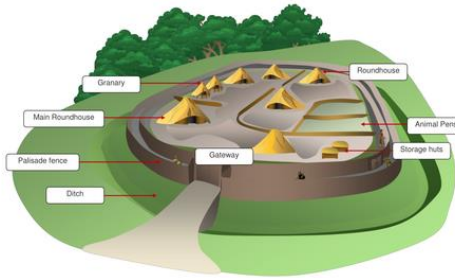
Palaeolithic era
(80,000 – 10,000 years)

(10,000 years ago – 4000BC)

Neolithic era
(4000BC – 2300BC)

Stone Age

Tools, weapons and other objects were made from pieces of stone, especially flint.



Stone was replaced by metal.

Bronze Age

Copper was the first metal to be used and then a harder metal came called bronze.

Bronze gave way to iron and even harder metal. Iron became the preferred choice of metal for making tools.

Iron Age

Farming became more productive and the population began to rise.

Most Iron Age people worked and lived on small farms and their lives were governed by the changing of the season.

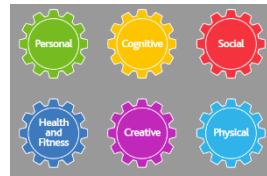
