evaluate – the process of deciding what went well and looking at what could be improved.

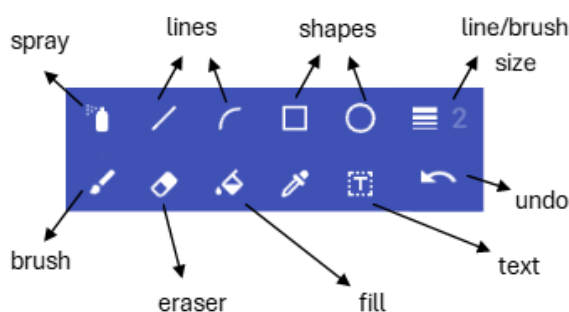
